

## RCMP Cost-Share Agreement Repeal Bylaw No. 8094-2026

**Recommendation:**

**THAT Council give first, second and third readings to “Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows Municipal Support Services Agreement Repeal Bylaw No. 8094-2026.”**

**Report Purpose and Summary Statement:**

To repeal Bylaw No. 4642-1992, which authorized the RCMP Housing and Support Services Cost-Share Agreement between the City of Maple Ridge and the City of Pitt Meadows.

**Financial Impact:**

Pitt Meadows will fund its proportionate share of RCMP housing and support service costs only up to March 31, 2026, with final invoicing to be prorated and reconciled in accordance with the agreement. Following termination, Maple Ridge will assume full responsibility for ongoing facility and municipal support service costs associated with its RCMP detachment.

## **RCMP Cost-Share Agreement Repeal Bylaw No. 8094-2026**

### **BACKGROUND:**

Bylaw No. 4642-1992 authorized Maple Ridge to enter into a cost-sharing agreement with Pitt Meadows for municipal support services and housing costs associated with the Maple Ridge RCMP Detachment.

On November 16, 2021, Ministerial approval was granted to Pitt Meadows to de-integrate from the Ridge Meadows RCMP Detachment in accordance with the approved Transition Plan. Pitt Meadows subsequently provided written notice of termination of the Housing and Support Services Agreement effective March 31, 2026

As the agreement will no longer be in force after that date, the authorizing bylaw is no longer required.

### **ANALYSIS:**

#### **Discussion:**

The City of Pitt Meadows has provided formal notice (attached) terminating the RCMP Housing and Support Services Agreement effective March 31, 2026. The agreement, authorized by Maple Ridge Bylaw No. 4642-1992, established a cost-sharing arrangement for municipal support services and facilities provided to the combined Ridge Meadows RCMP Detachment.

With Pitt Meadows proceeding with de-integration and the establishment of its own autonomous RCMP detachment (Ministerial approval granted November 16, 2021), the cost-sharing agreement will cease to have effect. The proposed repeal bylaw formally repeals Bylaw No. 4642-1992, while preserving any required financial reconciliations or administrative close-out obligations arising prior to termination.

#### **Strategic Alignment:**

This action supports orderly governance, financial accountability, and the formal close-out of inter-municipal agreements following service restructuring.

#### **Financial Impact:**

Pitt Meadows has requested that final invoicing be prorated to reflect services rendered up to March 31, 2026. Any remaining financial reconciliations will be completed in accordance with the terms of the original agreement prior to its termination.

Following termination, Maple Ridge will assume full responsibility for the costs associated with its detachment facilities and municipal support services.

**CONCLUSION:**

With the termination of the inter-municipal RCMP Housing and Support Services Agreement effective March 31, 2026, Bylaw No. 4642-1992 is no longer required. Adoption of the repeal bylaw will formally conclude this legislative authority and complete the governance transition associated with Pitt Meadows' de-integration from the Ridge Meadows RCMP Detachment.
